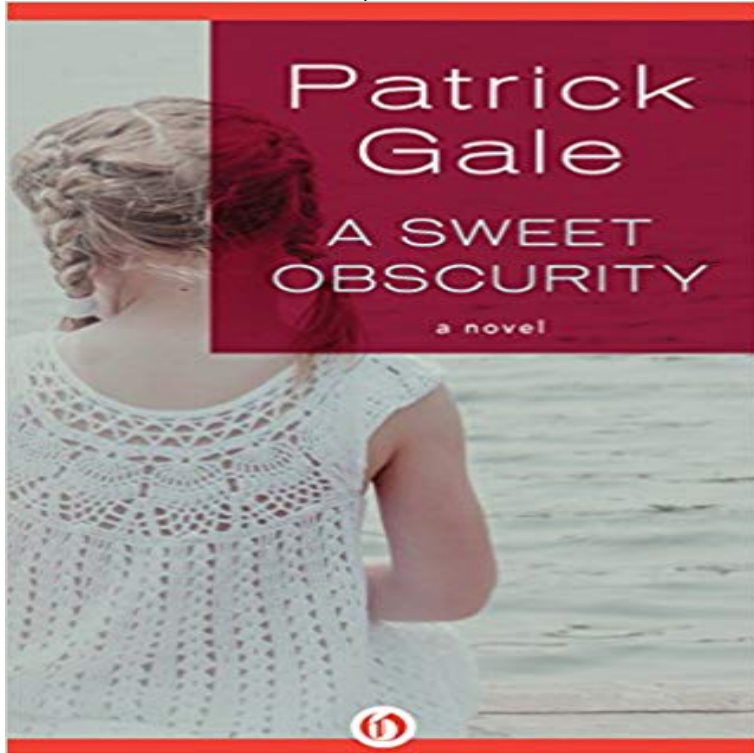


A Sweet Obscurity: A Novel
