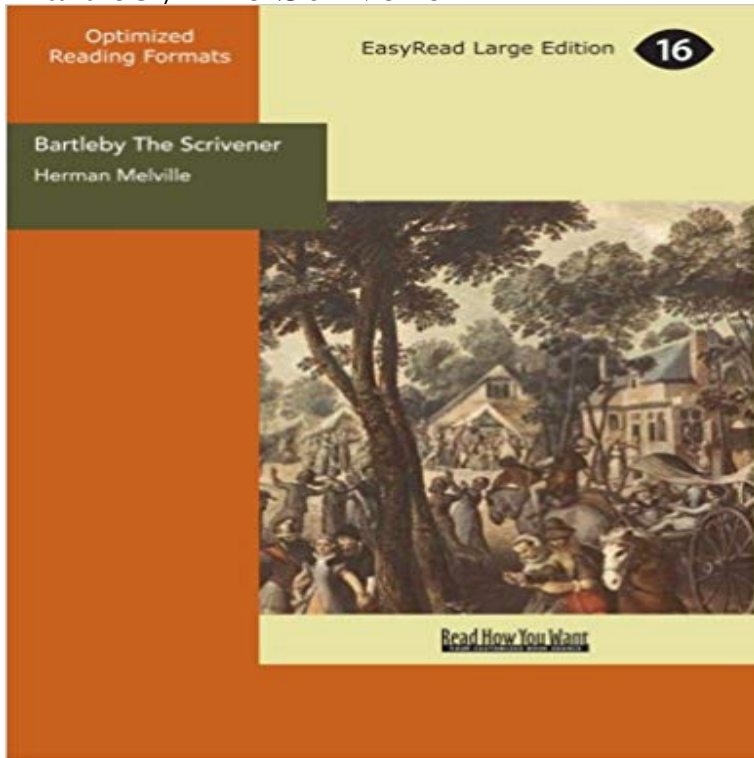


Bartleby The Scrivener
