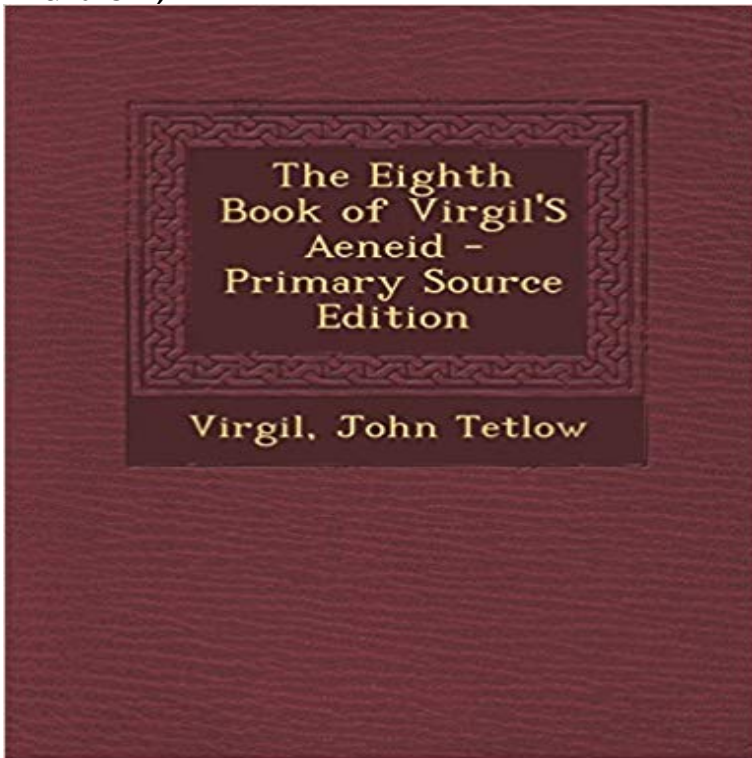


The Eighth Book of Virgil's Aeneid - Primary Source Edition (Latin Edition)
