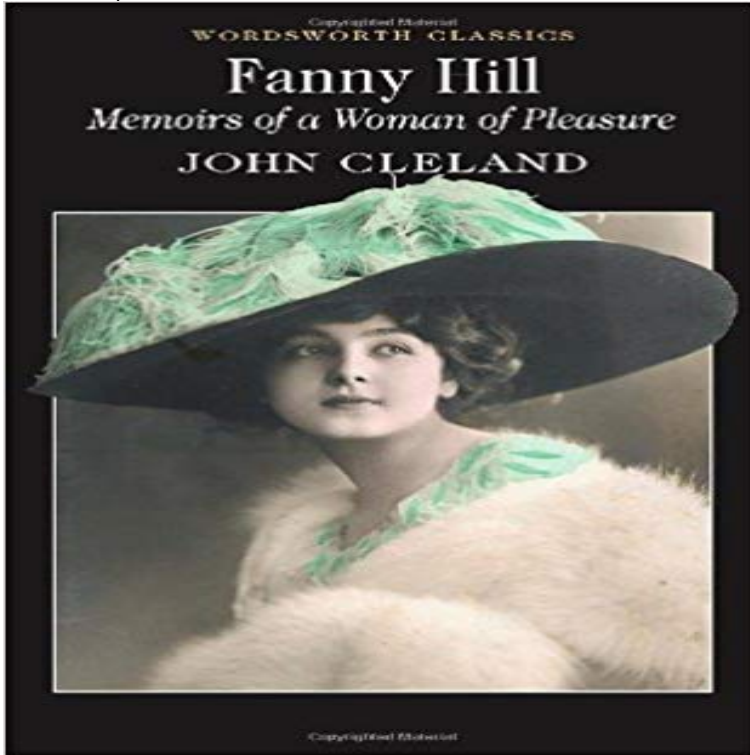


Fanny Hill: Memoirs of a Woman of Pleasure
