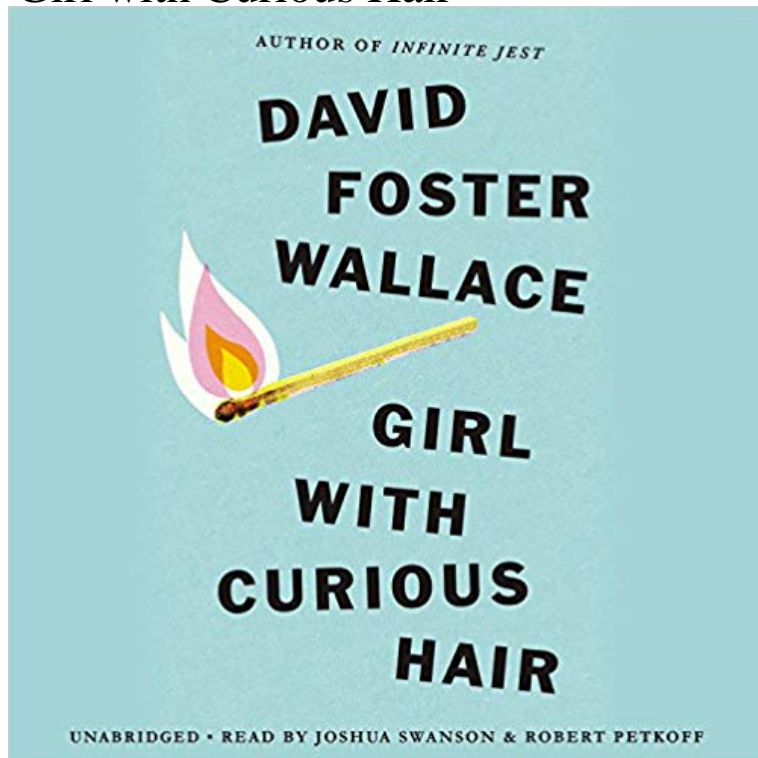


Girl with Curious Hair
