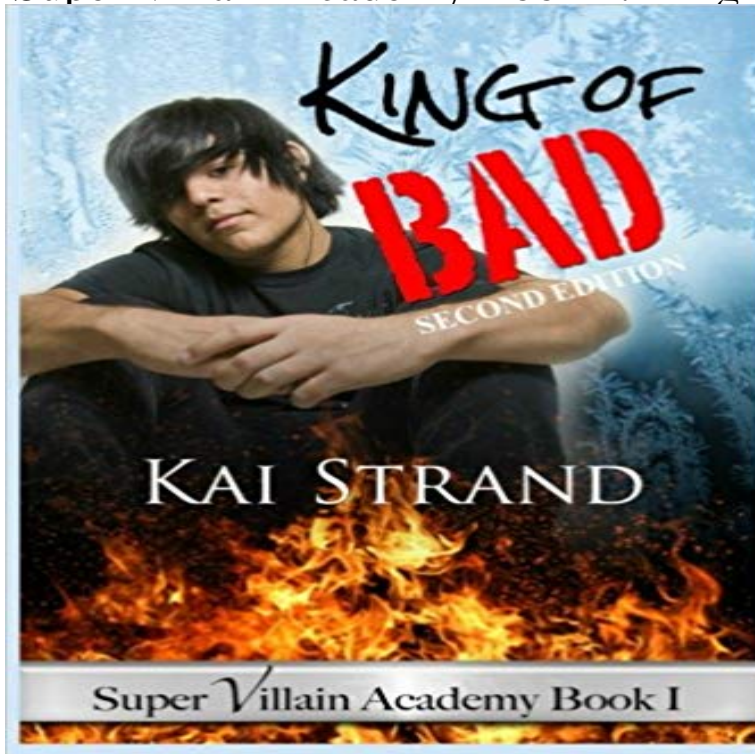


Super Villain Academy Book 1: King of Bad (Volume 1)
