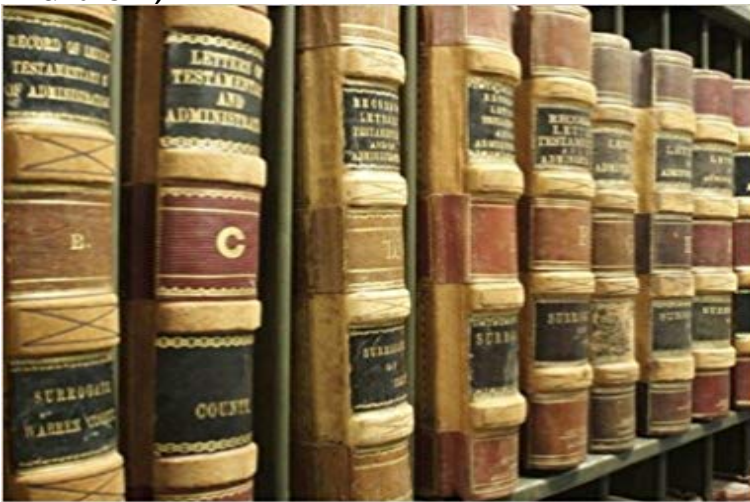


# The Petworth Ms. of Chaucers Canterbury Tales (Middle English Edition)
