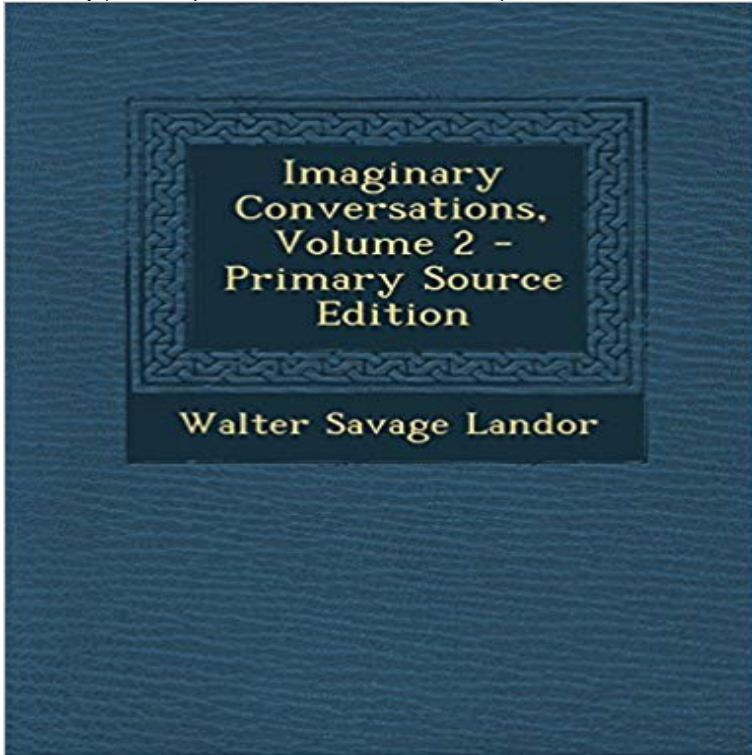


Imaginary Conversations, Volume 2 - Primary Source Edition
